Background

Makerere University (Mak) and the University of Bergen (UiB) will be organizing their first-ever joint doctoral research school under the Makerere-University of Bergen Collaboration. This ten-day event will be held from 28 November – to 9 December 2022 at Makerere University-Main Campus under the theme: Food and Water Security in a Changing World specifically addressing some of the main Global Challenges that are facing our world that also cut across severalof the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Considering the established SDGs and efforts to monitor progress, it will be beneficial for PhD students to interrogate the successes and challenges of meeting targets under the SDGs related to Water and Food Security. Climate change and current events around the world are severely threatening our ability to provide the food and clean water that future generations will require. This research school will address these challenges and discuss possible solutions and opportunities for Higher Education Institutions to play an active role in.

We use this opportunity to highlight the importance of partnerships between Higher Education Institutions, civil society, and private enterprises in meeting the SDGs, with some focus on the relevance of these partnerships to students and young career academics. This event is organized under a collaboration between two universities that has been running for more than 30 years, further highlighting the importance of **SDG 17** - *Strengthen the means of implementation and revitalize the Global Partnership for Sustainable Development*. Makerere University and the University of Bergen have had a long-standing collaboration that dates to 1988. The ties between these two institutions involve departments in various disciplines and have come to engage civil society, the public sector and industry. Student and staff exchange is central to this collaboration. Over the years the collaboration has deepened with graduating joint PhDs and capacity-building projects most recently in NORHED I and NORHED II programmes.
